Over \$34 million in private funds invested in providing a stable retirement for residents of the Miami Valley.\*



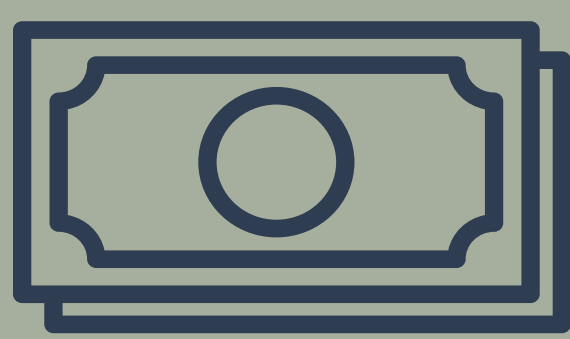
**\$29,406,565**

More than \$29 million contributed to caring for the physical and mental health of Dayton-area residents.\*



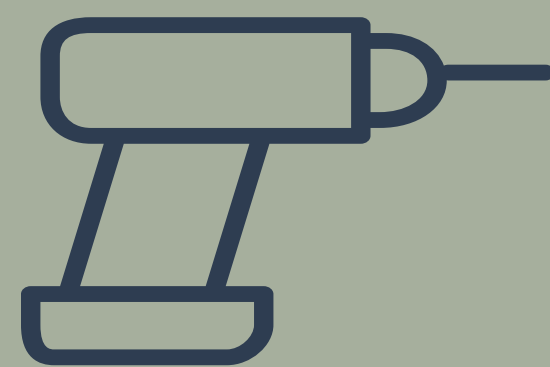
The 18 local unions represented by the Dayton Building Trades employ skilled men and women making good wages, raising families in the Miami Valley, and investing those wages back into the community.

**\$2,450,897**

**16 Skilled Trades**

Each one of the 16 Building Trades conducts rigorous training through its registered apprenticeship program. Apprentices receive on-the-job trade and safety training.



**500 Apprentices**
